- Emergency Preparedness Grab and Go Bag

If asked to evacuate your home it is better to be prepared beforehand and have a packed bag that you can (grab and go)

These items need to be placed in one bag. The following items should be in your bag:

- A list of family phone numbers where you can contact them.
- All your Medications.
- House keys
- Cash
- Personal items (soap, toothpaste, feminine hygiene products. Deodorant, etc.
- Glasses, contact lenses
- **Special Needs Items** – canes, walkers, wheelchairs, blood sugar meter and insulin pen, glasses, hearing aids with extra batteries. (These items are probably used daily, so keep in mind to have them easily accessible and take them with you if you have to evacuate)
- If you are diabetic –
- Glucometer and test strips
- Treatment for low blood sugar (e.g. dextrose tablets, sugar packets, juice boxes.

- Diabetes medication, insulin pen and needles, You will need to have your medication kept in a small cooler lunch bag.
- 3 changes of clothes, socks, panties, shorts, pants,(skirt), pj's. Comfortable jacket and or sweater.
- Pen and Paper
- Electronic charging devices for your phone, hearing aids or other.

These items are the essentials that you will need. It is important to have a bag ready and be on the *prepared safe side..*

Keep in mind to keep your wits about you. Going into panic mode when there is an emergency can cause more harm than good to yourself and the people around you. You will have assistance and will not be alone.

Change in Emergency Social Service Reception Centre

For Immediate Release (July 8, 2017 – 11:00 p.m.): As evacuated residents continue to arrive in Kamloops, the location of the Emergency Social Service (ESS) Reception Centre has been changed to Thompson Rivers University (TRU).

Effective July 9, 2017, the ESS Reception Centre will be available in the Old Main Building on the TRU campus. The Reception Centre will be open at 10:30 a.m.

TRU is currently providing accommodation and other services to evacuees, so ESS Reception was moved to TRU to make it convenient for evacuees when they arrive in Kamloops.
